Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) 2 Draft Application
Public Comment

The City of Aurora intends to submit an application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD for Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 (NSP 2) funds for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2009. The anticipated NSP 2 request for funding is estimated to be between \$9,000,000 - \$15,000,000. NSP 2 funding is intended to assist in the redevelopment of abandoned and foreclosed homes. The City's NSP 2 funding is targeted for the following activities: purchase and rehabilitate homes and residential properties that have been abandoned or foreclosed upon, acquire demolished or vacant foreclosed and/or abandoned properties for use as housing. The City's NSP 2 funds will be administered by the Community Development Division as the lead applicant.

All citizens are encouraged to provide comment on the Draft NSP 2 Application. The public comment period for this application will be from **July 2, 2009** to **July 13, 2009** to allow the public provide input to any of the proposed activities listed in the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP 2) Application. All comments received by **July 13, 2009 at 5:00PM** will be summarized and responded to in the final NSP 2 Application which will be posted on City's website. The NSP 2 Application will then be forwarded to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for review and approval. The Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 Draft Application is available to citizens upon request and can be accessed at the Martin Luther King Jr. Library at 8989 E. Colfax Avenue, Aurora, CO 80010 or can be accessed on-line on the City of Aurora website at www.auroragov.org. The application can be made accessible to persons with disabilities and non-English speaking persons upon request at the above location.
