Neighborhood Parking Permit Application

Permit conditions and requirements

Residents who live in a Neighborhood Parking Permit (NPP) district are eligible to apply. Complete and sign the application form and submit with the required document photocopies to the address provided. If approved, allow up to two (2) weeks for permit processing. Visitor Handtag Permits will be received by U.S. mail.

NPP permits exempt a vehicle from the posted, on-street parking restriction in the district specified on the permit. Permits do not guarantee a parking place, nor do they grant parking privileges in another NPP District. NPP permits do not allow parking in violation of loading zones, no parking anytime, handicapped parking, street sweeping, or any other parking restriction as defined in the Aurora Municipal Code. Abuse or misuse of a permit may result in revocation of said permits.

NPP permits are valid for one calendar year, and residents are required to renew their permits annually. Your vehicle's license plate will serve as your annual parking permit and may not be transferred from one vehicle to another without prior approval of the Park Aurora Parking & Mobility Program. A maximum of one permit per licensed driver will be issued to eligible residences. The first two resident permits are free, additional permits may be purchased for a fee of \$10 with no household maximum.

A maximum of two visitor permits per household are available at no charge and may be transferred from vehicle to vehicle. Visitor handtags are intended to be used for those vehicles that are not used by primary residents and are for occasional use by visitors. Visitor Handtag Permits will be received by U.S. mail. Visitor handtags that are used on the same vehicle for more than three consecutive days may be issued a citation for non-compliance of permit rules and regulations.

Special event permits are good for one specific day and are limited to ten. Twelve (12) events are free of charge; each event thereafter costs \$5 per event.

The use of NPP Permits is monitored. Abuse may result in citations and/or revocation of all permits issued to that household. All outstanding parking citations must be paid on a resident vehicle before a permit can be issued or renewed.

Resident permits

- Applicability** Permits for primary house members, only required when parking on-street restriction is in effect (per signage)
- Limit** One permit per driver, no limit (cannot have more permits than vehicles)
- Fee** First two permits are free, additional permits may be purchased for \$10 each
- Eligibility** Document residency (details listed below) Temporary Permit Provided to those applicants that cannot meet all residency documentation requirements upon application, issued for up to 30 days (by license plate)

Visitor permits

- Applicability** Permits for occasional household visitors, can also be used for day contractors (i.e., plumber truck), only during on-street parking restriction (per signage)
- Limit** Two permits per household (*resident permit not required to obtain a visitor permit*)
- Eligibility** Document residency (details listed below)

Special Event

- Applicability** Permits for large events only during on-street parking restrictions (per signage), used for a large special event at a residence
- Limit** 10 permits per event (*resident permit not required to obtain a special event permit*)
- Fee** Free for the first 12 events of the year, \$5 per event thereafter
- Eligibility** Document residency (details listed below)

Required Documentation

A copy of the following documents **must be provided** with your application to receive a permit. Documents must reflect the same address at which you are applying for a permit:

- Valid driver's license**
- Current motor vehicle registration**
- One of the following** (dated within the last 30 days)
 - Utility bill (e.g., gas, electric, water, tv, internet, phone, auto or home insurance policy)
