Folder 1: August 27, 2015. A 20-page State of the City Address in very large type is titled "Aurora: A Strong, Transforming City." A few additional lines have been added and some have been crossed out. He focuses on the city's strengths, diversity, international connections, employment, development, and arts.

Folder 2: 2014-2016. "Aurora at a Glance" lists details of Aurora's history, government, population, economy, housing, education, and industry, and presents a comprehensive strategic plan for 2015-2018 that focuses on integration. An invitation to a Consular Reception is dated November 2015. Five gold and silver medal awards for Steve Hogan are from the National League of Cities' "Healthy Communities for a Healthy Future" drive. Flyers list Hogan's keys to building a great Aurora.

Folder 3: 2015-2016. Examples of miscellaneous correspondence. The senders range from a local realtor, to the Director General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Denver, to the Consul General of Japan in Denver, to the Mayor of Indianapolis, to Michelle Obama (writing to *Let's Move* Stakeholder Cities).

Folder 4: 2016. An "Example of background info packet for the 2016 visit too El Salvador" includes a schedule, maps, profile of the country and profile of the modern Salvadoran migrant.
