as class projects over the years. Five blankets were donated with corresponding classroom materials. Miscellaneous student projects and photographs were also

donated to the archives.

Series I: Documents relating to the quilts

Folder 1: Contains documents relating to the "My Dragon" quilt, 4th grade class, 1980-1981. There is a newspaper clipping of the class shown sitting in front of their quilt; signs for the quilt; a class project involving every student drawing a picture of a dragon and writing a description; and a class roster.

Folder 2: Contains documents relating to the "Vaughn Elementary School Anniversary" quilt, 4th grade, 1981-1982. There is a receipt; signs for the quilt; roster sheets; list of student names with the subjects of their quilt pieces; copies of stitching guides; drafts of the quilt drawn out.

Folder 3: Contains documents relating to the "You and All the Animals in the Universe" quilt, 4th grade, 1982-1983. There is a picture of the class; signs for the quilt; drawings of animals by the students; blank postcards with animal designs on the front; class roster sheets; a book, "The Wildlife Alphabet Book," by Dorothy Manning.

Folder 4: Contains documents relating to the "On the go" quilt, 4th grade, 1983-1984. There is a class roster sheet; a picture of the 4th grade class that made the quilt; signs for the quilt; a packet with patterns for the quilt inside; copies of a stitching guide; and a stack of patterns for the quilt at the back of the folder.

Folder 5: Contains documents relating to the "Animals" quilt (yellow), 3rd grade, 1984-1985. There is a card dated 6/1985 containing pictures of children in a classroom, it can be assumed that these children created the quilt, but that information is not clear. There are two copies of the official class picture of the 3rd grade class that created the quilt; a class roster; and a folder containing patterns of animals for the quilt.

Series II: Miscellaneous class projects

Folder 6: Miscellaneous Art Project, October 1981. Contains a book, "Can I Keep Him?" by Steven Kellogg; and the art and writing project students completed using the same theme as the book.

Folder 7: Contains class projects from 1985 and 1986, it is not clear which grade the students were in. There is one project with teacher's comments on the front, no date; a letter to the teacher from a student dated March 7, 1985; and a class project with the photo of each student on their paper dated January 13, 1986.
