#### Spills:

2 reportable spills since our last meeting

#### February 20th

 The 1st was a mixture of fresh water and reuse water at the ground day the Grande South that reuse water not potable but was being used for COA golf courses. 100 barrels of water, not fresh but must be reported to CDPHE. The spill didn't make it to surface waters.

#### February 22<sup>nd</sup>

- At Grande North produced water from well, phase of separation from sand coming back up for several hours, human error. Didn't make past pad and was a COGCC reportable event. In both cases the Operator dispatched the cleanup crew immediately.

  - Website (Oil and Gas Drilling City of Aurora (auroragov.org)).
    - Ms. Alvarez Presentation of newly developed Oil & Gas webpage
    - Link will be sent out to committee members.
    - Over 3,000 layers of information are available on Aurora GIS server, allowing you to click on and off different layers.
    - Will be adding P&A wells in the future to the layer map.
  - Lowry Ranch CAP (outside Aurora, Arapahoe County)
    - update community interest and push back, latest status in October 2022, Crestone submitted documentation to COGCC, didn't pass the completeness check in the application stage, sent back to Operator for resubmittal.
    - COGCC could take several months to review the completed application for the Lowry Ranch CAP.
    - COGCC was getting so much interest from residents, a webpage was made available for this application.
    - Aurora O&G will be reviewing applications once it is made available as an external agency.
    - Arapahoe County Commissioners will be meeting on March 28 for O&G Moratorium, this
      is for 6 months to make adjustments to existing regulations.
    - Mr. Moore shared with O&GAC a one-minute video he created with the assistance of the Communications team regarding the Lowry Ranch CAP.
    - Mr. Blair shared there will be a preliminary meeting/discussion before March 28 with Study Session and Commissioner Session on March 20<sup>th</sup> at March 21<sup>st</sup> leading up to the meeting.

#### Staff Changes

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- David Scott, New City Attorney will be joining O&G group and will also be attending Energy and Environment Symposium.
- Forrest Thorniley, Sr. Inspector accepted another position out of state, this is his last group gathering.

- Mr. Moore gave huge kudos to Mr. Thorniley, only complaint from the Operator is that he is super thorough. Thanks to Mr. Thorniley, we (COA) was able to purchase FLIR camera for inspections, as well as air monitoring process and RFP. We were able to choose a vendor with his assistance and dedicated work.

  - 1st reason taking on Karen Hancock's responsibilities, covering environmental investigation and remediation, air quality network.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> reason not doing this immediately but looking to bring in other forms of renewable energy: solar, wind, geothermal permitting. Forms are available in the Building Department but hard to find and access.
  - Working with IT and Communications to transition to Energy & Environment.
  - No changes to occur to O&GAC.
  - Will be reviewing O&G Manual to make sure there are no further changes that must take place before changing over.
