The eclipse will begin at approximately 10:20 a.m., and finish around 1:15 p.m.

Learn about the eclipse and enjoy fun naturalist-led activities throughout the site.

- View the eclipse through a filtered telescope and with eclipse viewing glasses provided.
- The weather will likely be toasty, but that won't stop us from making s'mores around a campfire!
- Hike along rolling trails and keep on the lookout for prairie dogs, rattlesnakes, pronghorn antelope, coyotes and red-tailed hawks.
- Explore tipis and Native American culture at the authentic Cheyenne camp.
 Learn what local Native Americans historically thought about this astronomical phenomenon.
- Visit the small pioneer village that includes two sod houses, a black-smith shop and a one-room schoolhouse. Visitors can step inside and take a close look of what life on the high plains was really like in the mid-1800s.
