Mayor LeGare shared Council Member Berzins' sentiments on behalf of the City of Aurora regarding the recent tragedy in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Mayor Pro Tem Berzins asked if the City of Aurora was planning to do anything for Pittsburgh. Mayor LeGare stated he was unaware of any formal plans at this time and suggested it would be nice if Mayor Pro Tem Berzins took the lead in that regard. Mayor Pro Tem Berzins agreed to do so and welcomed any input from her fellow council members.

Council Member Johnston expressed appreciation to the Ward II residents and others who attended the recent Ward II Town Hall meeting where the budget measure was discussed. She announced the next Ward II Town Hall meeting was scheduled for Thursday, November 15, 2018 where various public safety items for Ward II would be discussed.

Council Member Gruber discussed his recent attendance at the military academy nomination process.

Council Member Roth spoke to Mr. Lindstrom's earlier comments related to Mayor Pro Tem Berzins' integrity regarding her vote at a previous meeting and clarified Mayor Pro Tem Berzins' votes which did not demonstrate a conflict of interest. He expressed appreciation to those who attended the recent Ward V Town Hall meeting which was a candidate forum and acknowledged Tom Ashburn and his service to the City of Aurora. He appointed Janet Marlow to the Citizens Advisory Budget Committee.

Mayor Pro Tem Berzins expressed appreciation to Council Member Roth for the clarification on her vote and to Axiom Strategies for their attendance at the Ward III meeting where they explained the ballot questions for Aurora. She expressed her condolences to the City of Pittsburgh as they dealt with the recent shooting tragedy there.

Council Member Bergan announced the next Ward VI Town Hall meeting was scheduled for Wednesday, November 14, 2018 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Mission Viejo Library where a presentation on cultural events and library programs as well as general updates would be provided. She discussed her attendance, as an E-470 board member, at the recent International Bridge, Tunnel & Turnpike Association (IBTTA) Conference in Baltimore, Maryland.

Council Member Richardson announced Ecotech Institute would be closing but would continue classes through October 2019 and he would continue to hold the Ward IV meetings there. He stated his hope someone would find a use for that beautiful facility.

Council Member Murillo announced the next Ward I Town Hall meeting was scheduled for Tuesday, November 20, 2018 at the MLK Library where a presentation by Planning and Development Services would take place. She expressed appreciation to the Aurora Police Department for their participation in the recent Colfax Clean-Up. She addressed a recent article that claimed 60,000+ ballots were missing in Adams County from zip code 80011, noting her understanding they have since been retrieved. She suggested those living in 80011 contact the Adams County Clerk with any questions or concerns in that regard.

Council Member Johnston pointed out the meeting minutes also reflected a vote in favor from Council Member Berzins.

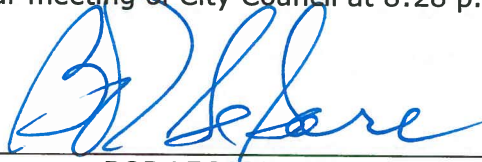
