Council Member Coombs stated the City had the possibility of any offense leading up to a year in jail so it would be any non-criminal offense.

Mayor Coffman stated all immigration offenses committed within the country were considered federal or civil offenses.

Council Member Bergan stated domestic abuse was considered a criminal offense and asked if animal abuse was as well. Mr. Brotzman answered affirmatively.

Council Member Gardner discussed his thought process for bringing the item forward. He pointed out the COVID-19 pandemic made him think of things he never thought he would have to and he felt people in these facilities were often overlooked by policymakers. He clarified the item did not target any specific facility nor was it a statement of immigration policy. He stated he understood advocating for people in these facilities could be controversial but he felt it was possible to advocate for a vulnerable population while respecting the rule of law and the criminal justice system.

Council Member Bergan stated although she was not a big fan of resolutions overall because they were non-binding, she would support the item because she felt it was important for the City to make sure people in those populations were well cared for during this crisis.

Council Member Coombs expressed appreciation to Council Member Gardner for bringing the item forward because it was important for the City to pay attention to public health medical experts in terms of how to prevent the spread of the disease and that included reducing detention center populations to allow for proper quarantining.

Mayor Pro Tem Johnston expressed appreciation to Council Member Gardner for bringing the item forward and for addressing these important issues.

Stephen Ruger, City Clerk, read related online comments into the record.

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Dr. Arnie Schultz spoke in opposition to the item unless the GEO Detention Center in Aurora. was included.

Feven Berhanu, Immigrant Justice Organizer, Colorado People's Alliance, spoke in support of the item.

- a. Report by the Mayor

Mayor Coffman raised the topic of his earlier conversation with Governor Polis regarding the governor's decision to extend the Stay-At-Home order until April 26, 2020. He stated his support of the order and his and the governor's hope that things would get better so it could end sooner.

- b. Reports by Council

Council Member Murillo expressed appreciation to everyone who joined the online Council meeting and recognized the challenges of the process. She announced the regularly scheduled Ward I Town Hall meeting would be virtual and the topic of discussion would be available resources.

Council Member Gardner expressed appreciation to City employees, police and fire and all essential employees for keeping the City running and he reassured everyone that they would get through it together.

Council Member Lawson expressed appreciation to City staff for their efforts in keeping the City Council connected and to all essential workers for the sacrifices they were making during this time. She assured everyone they would all get through this because they were *#Aurorastrong*. She asked everyone to stay safe.

Council Member Berzins expressed appreciation to City staff for making City Council's lives easier, and to all of the essential workers including police and fire. She asked everyone to stay safe, to wash their hands and to appreciate the people they were with. She announced the Ward III meeting scheduled for Thursday, April 16, 2020 was cancelled due to issues with the venue and because it was prudent for people to not go out.

Council Member Bergan expressed appreciation to City staff for working long hours to continue the City's services and business and for keeping everyone safe, to all first responders for the work they were doing and to the City's IT Department for setting up the new technology so that meetings, such as the recent Planning & Economic Development meeting where a presentation on providing aid to small businesses was given, could be held. She pointed out business and individual aid information could be found on the City's website at [www.auroragov.org](http://www.auroragov.org). She recognized the difficulty in adhering to the Stay-At-Home order and thanked everyone for doing what was necessary to keep everyone safe.

Council Member Gruber thanked everyone as well, noting these were trying times. He stated he and his fellow veterans likened the Stay-At-Home order to a military deployment noting the exception that the food was better, people were with families and the beds were more comfortable. He wished everyone the best working through it. He referenced the upcoming metro district elections which were planned for the fall and assured everyone the metro district presentations would continue and that those dates were still being worked out. He stated a list of open local restaurants could be found at visit <https://www.visitaurora.com/food-drink/takeout-delivery/> and he encouraged everyone to order from those restaurants and to tip the wait staff.

Mayor Pro Tem Johnston expressed appreciation to Council Member Gruber for encouraging everyone to order from local restaurants and pointed out restaurant gift cards could also be purchased. She thanked City staff for their efforts in providing information to City Council and to teachers, parents and students for their homeschooling efforts. She extended her sympathy to the 2020 class of graduating seniors noting this was a very difficult time but she assured them there would be increased resilience from this time. She announced the Ward II Town Hall budget meeting scheduled for Thursday, April 16, 2020 would be held virtually and access information would be provided.

Council Member Coombs echoed appreciation to everyone who had been thanked by her colleagues particularly frontline workers, City staff and local businesses, noting this was not what anyone could have planned and everyone was doing their very best to take care of the present for the sake of the future. She stated she missed her constituents and announced the Ward V Town Hall meeting scheduled for Tuesday, April 21, 2020 would be held online at 6:30 p.m. and that link would be posted on the City website. She stated Community Development and Homelessness Services representatives would join in the meeting to provide resources and she would provide COVID-19 resources and updates as well. She stated she would also be hosting brief live streams on Sundays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 7:00 p.m. on both Facebook and Twitter. She noted she also posted resources on those social media platforms. She asked everyone to remember to wear masks and to practice social distancing during outdoor activities, to wash their hands and to stay safe.

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Council Member Marcano echoed everyone's sentiments regarding appreciation to City staff, frontline workers and first responders for making the country run in the face of this pandemic. He encouraged everyone to visit [www.auroragov.org](http://www.auroragov.org) where there was a red COVID-19 resources ribbon icon that provided all available aid resources for individuals and business owners. He announced the next Ward IV Town Hall meeting would be online and was scheduled for Thursday, April 16, 2020. He expressed his hope that the meeting would be as interactive as possible and that City staff presentations on snow removal, trash and homelessness could still occur.
