Mayor Coffman extended condolences regarding a very tragic incident that occurred over the weekend where a police officer was lost, not in the line of duty, but in a motorcycle accident in Ward VI.

Council Member Bergan stated her thoughts and prayers were with the family of the officer as well as with the Aurora Police Department (APD) family. She stated it was always tragic to lose any human being but especially a police officer in the City. She confirmed the accident did take place in Ward VI and noted she was very saddened by it.

Council Member Berzins stated she would not support the item because that while she agreed Council had a fiduciary responsibility to the City's taxpayers to save as much money as possible, this felt discriminatory to the two groups called out in this manner.

Mayor Coffman asked staff to speak to the item as it related to government relations to the City.

Roberto Venegas, Deputy City Manager, did so.

Council Member Bergan stated she would not support the item for several reasons. She noted one reason was the ordinance stated *'the department would not pay any membership dues membership dues to any organization that has a legislative lobbying component to that organization's mission,'* and noted there were a number of organizations within the City that had membership that could be lobbying at some level. She stated there was an existing mechanism in place through FSIR where the City could oppose or support legislation and she did not think it was a necessary ordinance. She stated it basically pointed out Aurora Police (APD) and Fire Departments specifically without acknowledging all of the other organizations that would also be affected.

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Mayor Coffman asked staff if a lot of these organizations were also involved in professional development.

Chief Vanessa Wilson, Aurora Police, answered affirmatively. She noted given the obvious widespread scrutiny APD was currently under along with the many investigations underway that were examining their patterns and practices, it would be detrimental for her not to be able to be in touch with other chiefs and organizations who were on the cutting edge of technology, best practices and training.

Council Member Gardner reminded Council that he had language to bring forward that would eliminate other examples of this practice in the City therefore to insinuate that this was an attack on the police department was disingenuous and disappointing. He noted this information was mentioned previously in study session. He pointed out he did not understand why it was controversial when the City Council voted on several of the organizations' budgets and he simply wanted to see the same thing occur in this instance. He noted this was an accountability and transparency measure that required Council to vote on joining organizations that have a lobbying component.

Council Member Bergan stated her understanding there should not be lobbying that went against a city's best interest but noted there were a lot of organizations that did lobby in that manner and the Council could take a position of support or opposition on them specifically through the FSIR Committee and through the full Council. She reiterated this was already a practice and it was not necessary to have it in an ordinance. She suggested Council join the two organizations the Chiefs found value in and noted they should be added to the City's budget.

Mayor Pro Tem Johnston stated her support for the item, noting she was open to the discussion of supporting the request when it went to Council. She stated she would review those organizations more closely and pointed out the bottom line was there was scrutiny on APD and the community expected transparency and accountability. She stated her vote of support did not mean she was opposed to joining the professional organizations, noting she felt it was important to determine their lobbying positions for upcoming reforms.

Council Member Gardner referenced the Public Safety Committee minutes where he made statements that concurred with Mayor Pro Tem Johnston's regarding joining the organizations. He reiterated it did not matter what position Council took through FSIR, but instead mattered what position the organization took because that was where the money went and he did not think it was a good use of taxpayer money to lobby on different issues from what Council wanted in Aurora.

Mayor Coffman stated he could not think of a single organization in any department that aligned completely with the positions of the City.

Council Member Hiltz stated her support of the item and reiterated all of the other organizations were accountable to Council because Council determined their budget therefore having the Police and Fire have the same consideration for budgeting was completely in line. She stated not doing so was actually giving them preferential treatment as opposed to targeting them as was suggested.

Council Member Gruber stated this was fundamentally different from anything Council has done before because it made it illegal for the Chiefs to be members of these organizations. He discussed the various ways this could have been accomplished rather than making it a

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law. He pointed out it was obviously targeted to Police and Fire because they were the only two organizations called out in the item. He stated his intent to bring a resolution forward that would allow the Chiefs to join these organizations and he expressed his hope that his colleagues would vote to support it because APD needed all of the best practices possible.

Council Member Bergan referenced the resolution language related to lobbying not falling within the powers of the Police or Fire Chiefs but noted the discussion related to memberships. She asked Chief Wilson if she ever just decided on her own to lobby. Chief Wilson answered no. She stated she would bring that to the Deputy City Manager and City Manager if there was something she believed was important and then it would go to the FSIR Committee for permission. She reiterated this was about education and training only and she did not know what they would do if the item was approved and noted she did not understand why it was brought forward. Council Member Bergan pointed out neither chief would lobby on their own without permission from Council thereby making this ordinance unnecessary.

Council Member Berzins stated she did listen into the Public Safety Committee and she did believe it was discriminatory to the two groups because they were under scrutiny. She felt it was micromanaging professional people to give permission to the City's Chiefs to join a group they were already members of when they should be trusted to know what they needed.

16. **REPORTS**

a. Report by the Mayor

Mayor Coffman stated he was mourning the loss of one of the City’s own who passed not in the line of duty but in a horrific traffic accident.

b. Reports by Council

Council Member Coombs expressed appreciation to those who participated online in the recent Ward V Town Hall meeting and acknowledged the deaths of a police officer in an accident in Ward VI and a firefighter in Ward V who was injured in the line of duty.

Council Member Hiltz extended her condolences to the families of the firefighter and the police officer who were injured.

Council Member Marcano extended condolences to the families as well.

Council Member Lawson stated prayers and thoughts were with both families and announced the enrollment of the Civic Engagement Academy which started Thursday, October 1, 2020.

Council Member Murillo announced the Ward I Town Hall was scheduled for Thursday, September 24, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. and would be simulcast on Facebook. She echoed Council’s sentiments related to the officers’ passing.

Council Member Gardner announced the Aurora Day of Giving was scheduled for Saturday, September 26, 2020 at 10:00 a.m. at Gateway High School. He asked those who could volunteer to do so as four events were scheduled in that regard. He discussed the upcoming Movies in the Park event and extended condolences to the family of the police officer who died and acknowledged the passing of Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg as well.

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Council Member Gruber provided an update on the space command progress. He acknowledged the passing of the Aurora Police officer and asked people to be careful and to drive safely.

Mayor Pro Tem Johnston extended condolences to the firefighter and police officer's families for their loss and expressed appreciation to Council Member Gardner for acknowledging Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg, noting she was an inspiration to men and women alike.

Council Member Bergan restated her condolences to the officer's family. She discussed the recent Ward VI Town Hall, noting it was recorded and posted to her Facebook Council page for those who were interested in viewing it. She referenced the three-hour protest that occurred recently at her home and the subsequent threatening letter of demands she received which stated her job would be on the line and she would be added to their public blacklist where they would canvas and unseat her with one of their own people if the demands were not met. She stated if their goal was to scare her then they were unsuccessful but noted they did succeed at scaring her neighbors' children. She stated her neighbor's son was sobbing because he was so scared and did not understand why people were being so mean to Council Member Bergan and another neighbor heard her child state to his friend that he was afraid to go to school the next day because the bad people would be there. She stated she found that very disturbing in terms of holding a protest in a neighborhood where they were actually frightening children. She referenced the *Brother Jeff* show and read aloud a statement made by Council Member Marcano when he was on the show, *'But like, we need to hear from all of y'all, like that's the thing, like it's not enough to just get out in the street and wave a sign and make a lot of noise like that's important too, right? 'Cause the optics of that are very powerful and we'll scare some elected officials to get with the program.'* She stated that comment was terrible.

Council Member Marcano addressed Council Member Bergan and stated he was happy she was watching the *Brother Jeff* show and pointed out the comment was not directed at what happened to her. He stated it related generally to the activism seen around the country currently and was a general call to action for people to not just go protest and then go to sleep, but instead to seek out electoral action as well. He noted there were also other ways for people to get involved and he did not appreciate that characterization.

Council Member Bergan stated she did not appreciate what he said because she did take his comments as encouragement of threats on Council.

Mayor Coffman discussed his experience attending the opening of the Aurora Fox Arts Theater's 36th season and encouraged people to go out and see the show and support the arts and Aurora Fox. He confirmed the show was very professionally done and they did everything as far as public health went to keep everyone safe.

Council Member Berzins extended her deepest sympathies and prayers of the Aurora Police (APD) officer's family who passed away and she thanked her for her service to APD. She stated the officer was an organ donor and that was a huge gift that came out of tragedy. She also extended condolences to Justice Ginsberg's family.

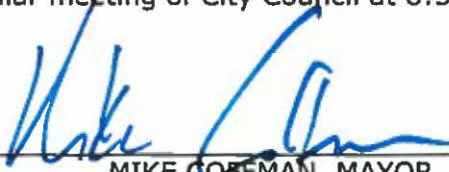

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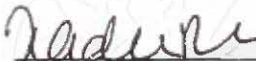
