CM Coombs mentioned it was stated that this resolution would create more transparency by allowing public discussion. However, the current rule already requires a public hearing, but the council did not carry it out during the most recent censure process. She said that she appreciates getting the lawyers out of the process, but she is still concerned about having council members make the decision. She added that if the majority votes to excuse you from consequences of wrongful actions, they can. She mentioned that the process would not end up as fact-finding but would just focus on if they agree with the person undergoing censure for breaking a rule or not. Mayor Coffman stated that a supermajority is required, not a simple majority.

Peter Schulte, Public Safety Manager, provided a summary of the item.

CM Marcano said the existing rules are less permissive and a lot of what is being added are things he thought they could already do. He expressed concerns about overcomplicating the rules and adding a grey area that previously did not exist.

CM Murillo asked for clarification regarding marketing techniques in Section K Subsection B. P. Schulte clarified. CM Murillo asked if this would be separate from somebody paying for a council member's ticket and if it is available for the public, then a council member can gain access to it. P. Schulte said that tickets for concerts could not be taken because they are more than \$100. However, if it were for discounts on the tickets that are also available to the public, then council members can avail of the discount. Mayor Pro Tem Bergan asked if someone buys them a ticket not given to the public, then would they have to put that in their disclosure reports. P. Schulte confirmed this.

CM Marcano stated he feels that undue influence is a separate issue from the \$300 limit. He added that whether someone wants to bribe him with coffee or box seats, then it would be undue influence and is unacceptable. He said they should not be opening potential justification for that. He asked what the purpose of the limits is because the rules already prohibit the Council to accept undue influence. P. Schulte said that the limits reflect what is also in the city code.

CM Marcano asked that if his mother or a close friend picks up a tab for him, then is he in violation of the rules. P. Schulte confirmed that he would technically be in violation of Section K. CM Lawson asked for clarification regarding the rules when a council member picks up a tab for another council member. P. Schulte said if there is no expectation of favorable treatment then it is allowed. He added it does not apply when it only involves fellow council members. CM Lawson highlighted there could also be influence amongst council members.

CM Murillo asked for clarification on Section D. P. Schulte stated that section D talks about things that are dropped off at council members' offices such as holiday gifts. He stressed that they are not to accept cash or gift cards or allow them to be delivered because they are strictly linked to the bribery statute.

CM Lawson announced that the next At-Large Town Hall meeting will be on May 6<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 PM at the Heather Gardens Clubhouse. It will cover the budget and public safety updates and gave FSIR Committee updates.

CM Zvonek reported that the Red Tape Reduction Committee held its final public hearing and is now in the process of addressing the issues presented. He thanked council members who served on the committee and staff. He mentioned that one potential result of the Committee is to remove the ban on ice cream trucks around the city.

CM Jurinsky restated that the At-Large Town Hall meeting is on May 6<sup>th</sup> at the Heather Gardens Clubhouse. She encouraged everyone to join.

CM Murillo thanked staff for hosting the 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue Mobility Study. She reported that she will be canceling her town hall for April and will reschedule.

CM Sundberg announced that his next Town Hall will be on May 19<sup>th</sup> at the Central Recreation Center to discuss metro districts. At Murphy Creek last night, there was street racing with 100 cars blocking the intersection of 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Gun Club. Due to this, patrons could not exit the gas station. Police were not able to respond to some in the past because of gunshots. CM Sundberg spoke with Commander Whitman and other officers to discuss their challenges.

CM Medina reported that his next Town Hall will be on May 4<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM at the Active Adult Center to discuss the budget.

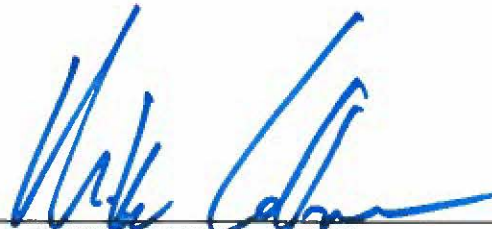
CM Marcano announced that the next Ward IV meeting will be on May 12<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM at Millie's Community Café. They will be discussing permanent supportive housing with Pastor Scott Boyer and Wanda Harrison, the director of resident services at Providence at the Heights.

Mayor Pro Tem Bergan reported that there has been an increase in mailbox theft and encouraged people to get their mail as soon as possible and not leave it in the mailbox overnight.

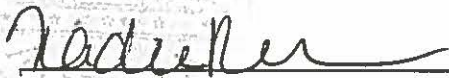
