He announced that the APD Family Safety Check Events will kick off at the end of June, with the first event scheduled on June 25th at the Salvation Army Facility near Delmar Park. CM Marcano announced that the next Ward IV meeting will be on June 9th at Colorado Early Colleges from 6:30 pm to discuss crime, what it takes to have charges filed, the burden of proof, and victims' rights. He added that he was able to attend the International Making Cities Liveable 2022 Conference in France which is part of the conference series from last year in Carmel, Indiana. He mentioned that there has been hearsay and lies regarding what the conference is for and who paid for it. A meeting will be held on June 1st from 6:30 pm to discuss the conversations about the suburb of Paris, conversations with city staff, and the Paris Regional Chamber of Commerce's Director General.

CM Coombs reported that Ward V concluded the two May town halls. During the town hall, there were discussions about what it will look like in Ward V when housing will come into shopping centers, and how the neighborhood's character and history can be preserved as density comes with change and growth. She shared news that Visit Aurora received the Smart Meetings Magazine Best Visitors Bureau or Destination Marketing Organization category in Advertising. They also received the Member of the Year Award from the Convention Management Association, Rocky Mountain Chapter.

CM Gardner and CM Zvonek had no reports.
