MPT Zvonek thanked Candace Atkinson and her team from detention, probation, and the Aurora Marshals for joining them at their At-Large Town Hall, and thanked everyone for attending. He also thanked the kids at Meadowood Child Development Center for allowing him to read to their class.

CM Murillo announced CM Coombs will be co-hosting her Town Hall this Thursday at the Aurora Fox, where they will get a tour and hear from directors.

CM Sundberg stated he attended a small business ribbon cutting of Wow! Scrubs and it was positive to see. He reported he had a great town hall, where they talked about the library director, retail, Highline Canal, and fire and rescue outreach. He discussed concerns with motorcycle and vehicle takeovers of parking lots and they are addressing that. He urged everyone to attend a wellness court graduation. He said they were hoping to duplicate this concept and take it to the Heart Program to assist the homeless.

CM Hancock also discussed the wellness court and stated people help them transition from a life they knew to a life they could have, and said they were choked up watching a man graduate and talk about his transformation. She reported she had a terrific town hall with CM Jurinsky last week and encouraged people to go to stephanieforaurora.com and give email address to be sent a newsletter.

CM Lawson thanked the Mayor and CM Coombs for attending the advocacy trip, and Liz Rogers for preparing them. She said their voices were heard and it was very impactful. She gave the legislative update for FSIR, including the House passing a \$95 billion funding package for Ukraine, Israel, and Taiwan, legislation to curb import of fentanyl, a bill to force ByteDance to divest from TikTok, and legislation signed by President Biden to extend surveillance powers under the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act. She then discussed state legislation, including the Colorado Department of Education distributing 24 million dollars from State Education Fund to schools who recently enrolled new immigrant students, and a multitude of bills that are starting to move through the process quickly. The next FSIR meeting is April 26th, at 1:00 pm. She thanked everyone who attended her town hall at Heather Gardens, and announced the next one will be April 30th, at the Central Library, from 6 to 8:30pm, with topics on the budget, strategic plan, and input with AFR.

CM Bergan stated she had policy committees, outside board meetings with E-470, the Opioid Governance Council, and was invited to attend Grandview High School's Amazon Future Engineers Event, where they awarded a senior a \$40,000 scholarship, attended Creekside's HOA meeting, and Chamber annual awards ceremony where she was recognized. She congratulated Jason Batchelor for receiving Man of the Year and CM Sundberg for Small Business of the Year Legends. She announced she would be at the multimodal meeting at Town's Reach Library tomorrow night and very excited everyone supported the Careers and Construction resolution.

CM Medina did not have a report.
